Emergencies may include invasions or infestations of animal pests, weed plants, certain fungal diseases, or dramatic changes in vegetation composition, which threaten ecological stability, where they cannot feasibly be controlled by conventional means;

The pesticide is used for protecting native species and forests against damage caused by introduced species or for protecting human health against dangerous diseases,	
or	
Use of the pesticide is the only economically, environmentally, socially and technically feasible way of controlling specific organisms which are causing severe damage in natural forests or plantations in the specified case (as indicated by consideration, assessments and preferably field-trials of alternative non-chemical or less toxic pest management methods),	
or	
Use of the pesticide has been ordered by the Government.	
<u>SPECIFIED CONTROLS TO MITIGATE THE HAZARD</u>	

The application shall specify the controls that will be implemented to mitigate the hazard associated with the use of the pesticide, for example restrictions related to weather conditions, soil types, application method, water courses, etc.

Approval is conditional to these controls being in place and/or being applied.

ACTIVITIES FOR DEVELOPING ALTERNATIVES

The application shall summarize activities for developing alternatives, and list any non 'highly hazardous' pesticides registered by national authorities for controlling the pest organism.
